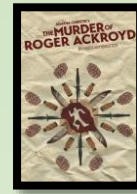

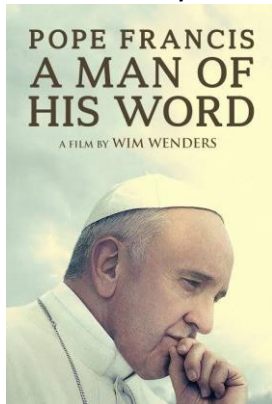

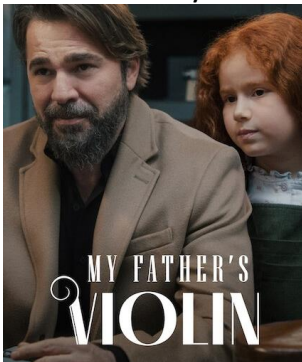

## **Erie Canal Bicentennial Speaker Series presented by Explore Buffalo**

May 1<sup>st</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> from 3PM to 4PM in Coventry Hall

This speaker series is a VIDEO presentation and will be projected on the screen in Coventry Hall.

### **May 1st: From Creek to Canalside**

Explore Buffalo's relationship to the Erie Canal from creek to Canalside and citizens from our past and present. Canalside is important to Buffalo's history as a major player in America's growth, a post industrial Rust Belt and a proud resurgence as a "New Boomtown".

### **May 8th: A Dream, a Ditch and a Doorway: The Original Erie Canal**

Two hundred years ago, in 1825, the dream of uniting the USA from the Atlantic Ocean to the Great Lakes came true. After eight years of work, the Erie Canal opened on October 26. The Erie Canal quickly became the doorway through which people and goods traveled between the east and the west.

### **May 29th: Life on the Erie Canal: The Workers, the Travelers, and the Heroes**

When the Erie Canal opened in 1825 some that helped build the canal went on to work on canals around the country. Others stayed in the area and settled into farm life or took jobs in the factories springing up along the canal. Then there were some that worked on canal boats becoming life-long 'Canalers'. Hear what their everyday life was like along the Erie Canal.
